


In 610 CE, Muhammad received his first revelation from Allah. He began to preach the message of Islam, and he quickly gained a following.



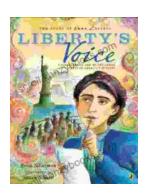
